

2022-2023 In-Person Instruction and Continuity of Services Plan

Instruction

- The Academy will provide in-person instruction.
- The Academy will provide educational support for students and families who are impacted by illness by utilizing Schoology, a learning management system (LMS), where everything (grades, attendance, resources, etc.) is available on one platform.
- The Academy will provide educational technology for students and staff to improve instruction and implementation of the curriculum.

Staffing

- The Academy will hire new staff to reduce class sizes to meet the needs of learning loss.
- The Academy will provide retention bonuses to existing highly-qualified staff members to maintain high-quality instruction and continuity of services.
- The Academy will provide professional development to improve instruction, address learning loss, and close gaps.
- The Academy will help address the teacher shortage by working with current staff members looking to expand their certifications to assist with filling vacancies.

Social-Emotional Learning

- The Academy will provide social-emotional support for students' and families' needs through evidence-based curriculum and professional development.
- All students and staff will have access to an on-site professional mental health counselor.

Illness

- The Academy will continue to work closely with the HDNWM, including weekly reporting of communicable diseases.
- The Academy will adhere to local public health requirements and the CDC Isolation and Precautions for People with COVID-19 will adhere to local public health requirements and operating procedures.
- The Academy recommends that everyone monitor their symptoms and stay home if they feel ill.

Testing

- COVID testing of students or staff will not be required unless mandated by a local or state agency and/or a sanctioning body.
- The Academy is participating in the <u>State of Michigan's Backpack Program</u>. This program provides rapid tests to families for at-home use.

Air Quality

• The Academy continues to make upgrades to our HVAC systems to improve indoor air quality: including maintaining, replacing, and upgrading systems.

Cleaning

- Increased cleaning of frequently touched surfaces and maintenance protocols that include:
 - Hand Sanitizer Available in all Classrooms
 - Endura Antimicrobial Coatings
 - i Wave Air Purifiers
- Hands-on classrooms will undergo cleaning after every class period with an EPA-approved disinfectant.

Hygiene

- Adequate supplies to support healthy hygiene behaviors will be provided (including soap, hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol for safe use by staff and students, paper towels, tissues, and signs reinforcing proper handwashing techniques).
- Handwashing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and/or the safe use of hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol will be taught and reinforced.

Our commitment to ALL students remains clear for the 2022-23 school year:

- Every student will have access to grade-level instruction and high-quality, standards-aligned instructional materials.
- Every student's academic and social-emotional needs will be addressed through the implementation of evidence-based interventions.
